






#### THE SOLUTION

# THE CHALLENGE

Climate change and changes in economic activities are creating a gap between socio-economic needs and physical-territorial resources within the Alpine Region. This causes marginal territories to grow more disconected, leading to depopulation and lack of job opportunities.

## THE OUTPUTS

- **★ Climate AntiFragile Territories:** the pilot project considers the effects of climate change on land-use, the built environment and the landscape;
- **★ Transitioning Spaces:** the pilot project analyses changes in economic activities and related spatial transformations
- **★ Enabling Marginal Territories:** the pilot project promotes the development of innovation ecosystems supported by spatial regeneration strategies and actions
- Design for AntiFragility: the pilot project applies the trans-scalar spatial approach of spatial planning and design to European cohesion, recovery and transition policies
