A1: *New expectations and new users: the need to change the offer*

The increase in the number of visitors to sites, which has been observed for several years and has been amplified after decontamination, as well as the arrival of new practitioners and new demands, raises questions about the offer: how to adapt to these new flows? How can the NPC and tourism actors set up integrated and diversified offers? Can we see this as a new development opportunity for the territories?

B1: *Responsibility for practices: local authorities are committed*

The recent deconvention of climbing sites raises the question of responsibility as a priority issue for local authorities. What are the answers to this issue? What initiatives have been launched in the territories?

C1 (FR/EN/IT): *Economic benefits and biodiversity: changing models*

How can we rethink our economic models in favour of greater consideration and respect for living organisms? How can we move towards a more integrated model, towards short circuits? Is paying access to sites a viable solution?

A2: Organisation of itineraries: improving territorial coordination

How to facilitate the customer journey? Associating local actors to improve networking allows thinking coherently about the question of accommodation, the sharing of routes, etc. of all nature sports.

B2 (FR/EN/IT) : The role of practitioners, supervisors and federations: feedback from the European level

This workshop proposes a European perspective through several feedbacks on the questions of responsibility of federations, the responsibility of the participants by themselves and the sharing of responsibilities when the practice is supervised.

C2: Sustainability of natural environments: supervising practices and developing sites

What are the examples of reasoned development, communication, integration into urban planning documents, etc. to ensure conciliation between the development of tourist activities linked to NPC practices and the preservation of the natural environment? What about closing off certain areas?

A3 (FR/EN/IT): Practices and sharing of space: favouring consultation

Using the example of pastoralism, issues related to the sharing of space, communication and awareness-raising will be addressed. Pastoralism illustrates the need for mediation in order to ensure the cohabitation of practices in the face of actors with sometimes divergent interests. What actions (warning systems, signage, tourist offers, mobile applications, etc.) can be implemented to improve this necessary cohabitation?

B3: Safety, security and rescue: everyone's business

The lack of equipment and training for newcomers is leading to an increase in the number of accidents and raises questions about signage, information, prevention and also the training of professionals. How can we make sites safer and make people more responsible? As for the emergency services, how can they be coordinated to be more efficient?

C3: Respect for the environment: raise awareness, include and support users

Behaviours that do not respect the environment have increased (particularly after deconfinement), raising the question of how to raise awareness among users. What effort should be made to popularise the scientific impact? How can the environment be appropriated to encourage spontaneous respect? What are the existing tools and approaches that have already proved successful?
