Limitations on entry

Free movement is allowed to and from Austria, France, Germany, Slovenia, Liechtenstein and Switzerland for any reason.

Requirements for entry into Italy

Upon entry into Italy, the following will be mandatory:

- fill in the [Digital Passenger Locator Form](#) before entering Italy. The form replaces the self-declaration made to the transport operator.
 - provide the [EU Digital Covid Certificate](#) or [other equivalent certification](#) in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French or Spanish, showing one of the following conditions:
 - having completed the prescribed anti-SARS-CoV-2 vaccination cycle¹
- or**
- that you have recovered from COVID-19 (the certificate of recovery is valid for 180 days from the date of the first positive swab)
 - undergo a molecular **swab** carried out within **48 hours** prior to entry into Italy and the result of which is negative, or an antigenic swab carried out within **24 hours** prior to entry into Italy and the result of which is negative.

¹ The certificate of completion of the vaccination cycle must include one of the four vaccines approved by the European Medicines Agency: Comirnaty by Pfizer-BioNTech / Moderna Vaxzevria / Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) / Nuvaxovid (Novavax) / or to vaccines considered equivalent by Italian law (See the circular [Equivalence of anti SARS-CoV-2 / COVID vaccines administered abroad](#))
