

Wood has been a traditional construction material in the Alpine region for centuries, but its various advantages have never been more important than now. As a sustainable and locally available resource, the use of wood is a climate-friendly alternative which also supports the local economy, helps cut costs and time in construction, features excellent energy efficiency, makes for an enjoyable and comfortable living environment, and fosters a sense of regional identity. As an Alpine Region Preparatory Action Fund (ARPAF) project, Triple Wood aims to promote a sustainable wood building culture in the EUSALP Region that brings social, ecological, and economical benefits to its communities.

TRIPLE WOOD consists of...

- an **exhibition** of best practice examples from seven countries that showcases smart uses of timber as a construction material, be it long-spanning bridges, spectacular 24-storey highrises, affordable housing buildings or innovative refurbishment methods,
- **seminars** on wood construction and energy efficiency fit for interested parties with no previous wood building experience as well as experienced actors intending to deepen their understanding and to build a regional network,
- a **road show** featuring the exhibition, seminars, and public events at several locations in all partner countries,
- an **internet site** presenting the exhibition projects and the schedule of the road show as well as providing further information on related topics (www.triplewood.eu).

About ARPAF

To support the implementation of the EUSALP strategy in the fields of environment, transport and depopulation, a funding for preparatory actions of 2 million Euro was granted by the EU Parliament. The six funded projects share the goal of boosting the economy and the social prosperity of the area with a strong focus on sustainability. A new relationship between metropolitan, peri-mountain and mountain areas is the main added value of this approach.
